Dave graduated Magna Cum Laude from University of Maryland School of Medicine, and did a rotating internship at the University of Oregon in Portland before joining the Air Force as a General Medical Officer. After 2 years overseas in Holland, he became a flight surgeon, and flew in the F-4 Phantom. He served as Clinic Commander at three different locations, including the Bolling Clinic in Washington D.C. After completing a Family Practice Residency at Malcolm Grow Medical Center, he was Residency Director at the USAF Hospital, Carswell AFB, Texas, and held the same position at Malcolm Grow for many years. He finished his Air Force career as Chief of the Medical Staff at Malcolm Grow and had attained the rank of Colonel. Upon retirement, Dave went to work for Kaiser Permanente at the Springfield center. 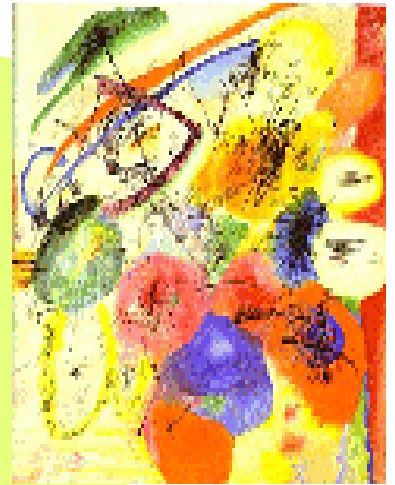
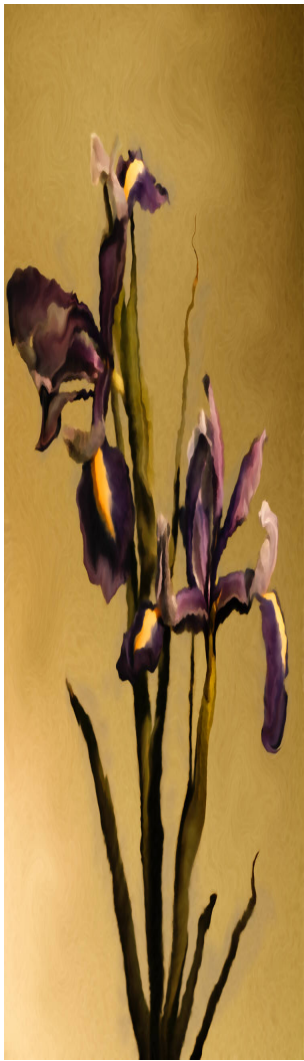
